The Garbage bin that is located in Cochrane for all Summer Village of Waiparous residents is intended for household waste only. **Please do not dispose of large items such as furniture or appliances in this bin.**

Landfill access is available at the City of Calgary Spyhill location The Summer Village is a member of the Cochrane ECO-Centre and they welcome all of your recycling.

The Cochrane Eco Centre is located at 50 Griffin Industrial Point Tuesday - Saturday 10 am – 6 pm (closed holidays)

The Centre accepts a large variety of items:

- Newspaper
- Cardboard
- Mixed Paper
- Plastic Bags and Film
- Metal and Tin
- Mixed Plastic
- Beverage Containers
- Glass and Jars Automotive Waste
- E-Waste
- Expanded Polystyrene (*excluding colored foam, egg cartons, meat trays or takeout containers*)

- Hazardous waste
- Food waste (composting)

Community wide Wood Chipping



Begins July 22

Last year's wood chipping project was again well received by residents. Council has agreed to offer the program once again this year. Residents are encouraged to

clean up wood debris from their properties and have it ready for wood chipping. **The Village has hired a Commercial Operator to drive around the Village starting July 22nd to chip your tree branches:**

- that are up to **4 inches in diameter;**
- that can be **lifted by hand,** and
- that are **neatly stacked beside the road in the front of your property with butt ends of the branches all facing the road**

This is a great opportunity to start (or expand) you own FireSmart Yard Plan and get rid of all that tree debris!!

If you would like to keep your wood chips, then securely tie a 2-3 foot length of florescent orange surveyor tape on one of the branches, clearly visible from the road, and the operators will then leave the woodchips in place for you.

Any piles that are not neatly stacked near the roads and/or branches that are too heavy for the operators to lift by hand will not be chipped and you will be responsible to haul it away.

Emergency Broadcast Testing

It is located on the Fees & Forms page. Email, mail, or fax the completed form to the Village office to have your numbers added to the list. . Paper copies will be available at the AGM as well.

Note: the system accepts both Canada and US numbers.

Please note that the emergency broadcast is an informal "best attempt system" for the Village to try to advise as many residents as possible of a potential emergency in the Village. It is not 100% accurate and the Village does not assume any liability for missed or dropped calls.

Highway 40 Bridge Project

With the change in Provincial government this spring, Council asked the new Minister of Transportation for his assurance that the work done on the 2018 Functional Review by the Province's consultant HATCH was not all in vain. Council asked the Minister to endorse the recommendations from the Functional Review and ensure residents that this Government would continue to proceed with Alignment 1A. I am pleased to share that Minister McIver did respond positively to our request and he has assured Council that Alignment 1A, placing the bridge in a location close to the current bridge is still what is being planned. Council will be consulting with Alberta Transportation to discuss the Preliminary Engineering Report once that has been made available.
